**Camping** Woodland Park is our  
full-service campground right on  
Lake Superior. Pictured Rocks  
National Lakeshore to the west and  
Lake Superior State Forest to the  
east offer 665 campsites within 20  
miles of town.

**Fishing** Catch whitefish right  
from our pier, or head to one of the  
many inland lakes and rivers to try  
your hand



at perch,  
bass, pike,  
and trout.  
Boats for  
inland fish-  
ing can be  
rented in  
town.

Fishing charters are also available.

**Biking** We  
have the quiet,  
scenic roads  
you're looking  
for! Bikes can  
be rented in  
town. Our  
self-guided  
historic tour  
makes a great  
2.7 mile ride, with 25 stops around  
Grand Marais.



**Boating** Launch your craft at  
our marina, where you'll also find  
fuel and dock-  
age. There are  
boat launches  
at many of the  
inland lakes in  
the area.



Grand Marais  
also marks the eastern end of the  
**Hiawatha Water Trail**, a 120-mile  
sea kayaking route extending along  
Lake Superior to Big Bay. Canoes  
and kayaks can be rented in town.

**Hiking and Geocaching** Take  
a short stroll or a long-distance  
hike and see lighthouses, ship-  
wreck remains, or hunt for one of  
the many geocaches in the area.  
Want a longer hike? The **North  
Country Trail** runs right through  
Grand Marais.

**Family Fun** Spend the day at  
one of our  
beautiful  
beaches, go  
rock hunting,  
have a picnic,  
fly a kite over  
the lake, eat  
an ice cream cone, take a bike  
ride — relax and enjoy our friendly,  
small-town atmosphere.



**History** is everywhere in Grand  
Marais! We have four museums,  
two historic cemeteries, and a  
self-guided historic tour right in  
town. The Pickle Barrel House is  
one of  
Michigan's  
most  
unique  
buildings  
and is  
open to  
the public.



## Skywatching and Birdwatching

The endangered Piping Plover  
nests on our beaches, and a host  
of birds from eagles to sandhill  
cranes frequent our shores. We  
have some of the darkest night-  
time skies in the entire country,  
perfect for skywatching.

**Winter Sports** Miles of  
groomed snowmobile, snowshoe,  
and cross-  
country ski  
trails are  
waiting for  
you. Snow-  
mobiles can  
be rented in  
town.
